

# Update 27: Colombia - Implements Negative COVID-19 Test Requirement for Arriving Air Passengers; Reports 9,412 New COVID-19 Cases

- Colombia's Ministry of Health issued a resolution requiring a PCR test with negative results for all travelers who want to enter Colombia from January 1, 2021
- According to this rule, the test must be taken a maximum of 96 hours before the flight and must be presented by all travelers without exceptions due to age
- Those who had difficulties taking the test or obtaining the result within the term stipulated for the flight may enter Colombia and must keep mandatory isolation for 14 days
- The resolution indicates that the passengers with fever or respiratory symptoms associated with COVID-19 and those who have not previously filled out the Check-Mig application will not be allowed to board
- In addition, the measure applies to nationals and tourists, and that the costs of the PCR test and preventive isolation will be in charge of the traveler
- According to the Government, the isolation must be monitored by the Ministry of Health of the place of disembarkation and may end sooner if the result of the PCR test is negative
- Colombia registered 9,412 new COVID-19 cases with 200 more deaths over the past 24 hours
- As of now, the country has reported 1,675,820 confirmed COVID-19 cases with 43,965 deaths, 2.6% of total reported cases, and 1,444,041 recoveries, 86.1% of the total reported cases
- When compared to the overall population of the country, confirmed COVID-19 cases and fatality rate stands at 3.2% and 0.08%, respectively

# Impact level Definitions

Impact Level	Definitions
Immediate	<b>Certain</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends considering prompt action. Examples of Immediate level alert events may include bankruptcy filings, data breaches, unexpected curfews, strikes, power black-outs, major geo-political events etc.
High	<b>Highly likely to occur in the near term (within 3 months)</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends being in a state of readiness to take quick action. Examples of High level alert events may include withdrawal of rating by ratings agencies, hostile takeover, multiple cyber-attacks, new business policies causing significant hardship etc.
Medium	<b>Likely to occur in the mid-term (within 3 to 6 months)</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends reviewing current mitigation steps and being ready to take proactive actions if and when situation deteriorates further. Examples of Medium level alert events may include unplanned C-level exits, suppliers caught in bribery cases, economy slipping into recession.
Low	<b>Possible in the long-term (after 6 months)</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends taking proactive action if situation does not resolve. Examples of Low level alert events may include lawsuits filed against suppliers, client losses, air pollution alerts issued by country's local authorities, unexpected holidays announced for the location etc.
Informational	The event is pertinent information but does not have a risk element associated with it. Examples of Info level alert events may include launch of new solutions, partnerships signed, industry outlook, positive changes in government policies, announcements regarding launch of software parks/ free trade zones/special economic zones etc.
