Update 24: Southern Algeria - Faces Twin Epidemic Threat Amid New Cases of Malaria and COVID-19

- . Algeria has witnessed a sudden outbreak of malaria with 1,110 cases in five states in southern part of the country
- As of September 29, Tamanrasset recorded the largest number of cases (918), followed by Adrar (96), and Illizi (89 cases)
- Ouargla and Ghardaia (south) reported 5 and 2 cases, respectively
- This outbreak comes while the COVID-19 infections continue to spread in the country despite its marked decline in recent weeks
- As of September 29, Algeria recorded 155 new infections, bringing the national tally to 51,368
- Number of related fatalities increased to 1,726 (~3.37% of total infections) with 7 deaths in 24 hours
- In May 2019, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared Algeria a 'malaria free zone' as the second African country to eliminate the disease, after Mauritius

Actions to consider:

- Determine if all management teams in impacted areas are current on all government-designated guidelines and restrictions and are aware of possible misdiagnosis due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and Malaria outbreak concurrently
- It is advisable that third parties or captive units fumigate their office premises often and regularly change stored water in tanks, coolers, and containers, if any
- SW Subscribers should determine if third parties or captive units have in-house health professionals to detect sickness and quarantine suspected disease carriers spotted within the business premises, if any
- It is advisable that third parties or captive units educate employees and conduct workshops to help increase awareness about the vector-borne diseases and its preventive measures

Impact level Definitions

Impact Level	Definitions
Immediate	Certain - Supply Wisdom recommends considering prompt action. Examples of Immediate level alert events may include bankruptcy filings, data breaches, unexpected curfews, strikes, power black-outs, major geo-political events etc.
High	Highly likely to occur in the near term (within 3 months) - Supply Wisdom recommends being in a state of readiness to take quick action. Examples of High level alert events may include withdrawal of rating by ratings agencies, hostile takeover, multiple cyber-attacks, new business policies causing significant hardship etc.
Medium	Likely to occur in the mid-term (within 3 to 6 months) - Supply Wisdom recommends reviewing current mitigation steps and being ready to take proactive actions if and when situation deteriorates further. Examples of Medium level alert events may include unplanned C-level exits, suppliers caught in bribery cases, economy slipping into recession.
Low	Possible in the long-term (after 6 months) - Supply Wisdom recommends taking proactive action if situation does not resolve. Examples of Low level alert events may include lawsuits filed against suppliers, client losses, air pollution alerts issued by country's local authorities, unexpected holidays announced for the location etc.
Informational	The event is pertinent information but does not have a risk element associated with it. Examples of Info level alert events may include launch of new solutions, partnerships signed, industry outlook, positive changes in government policies, announcements regarding launch of software parks/ free trade zones/special economic zones etc.

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
