# Update 23: United States of America - Surpasses 10 Million COVID-19 Vaccinations Nationwide; Extends Border Closure for Non-Essential Services with Canada Until February 21, 2021

- · According to the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), more than 10 million Americans have received their first dose of a COVID-19 vaccine as of January 13, 2021
- Strict rules putting healthcare workers first in line had slowed the vaccine rollout
- · Now states are urged to vaccinate anyone over 65 as well
- The milestone came as the US set a new record for COVID-19 deaths in one day, with 4,336 fatalities on January 12, 2021
- Nearly 30 million doses of the vaccines, manufactured by Moderna and Pfizer with its German partner BioNTech, have been released to US states, which have used only about one-third of them
- Additionally, Canada's borders to the US will remain closed to non-essential travelers until at least February 21, 2021 as the COVID-19 pandemic continues
- Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau announced the extension of the restriction
- The current restrictions were set to expire on January 21, 2021
- The travel restriction was first imposed in March 2020 to limit the spread of the COVID-19
- Essential workers such as healthcare professionals, airline crews and truck drivers are still allowed to cross
- As of now, the country reported 23.616.345 confirmed COVID-19 cases with 393.928 deaths, 1.7% of the total reported cases and 13,975,036 recoveries, 59.2% of the total reported cases
- When compared to the overall population of the country, confirmed COVID-19 cases and fatality rate stands at 7.11% and 0.12%. respectively

### SUPPLY WISDOM Impact level Definitions

Impact Level	Definitions
Immediate	Certain - Supply Wisdom recommends considering prompt action. Examples of Immediate level alert events may include bankruptcy filings, data breaches, unexpected curfews, strikes, power black-outs, major geo-political events etc.
High	Highly likely to occur in the near term (within 3 months) - Supply Wisdom recommends being in a state of readiness to take quick action. Examples of High level alert events may include withdrawal of rating by ratings agencies, hostile takeover, multiple cyber-attacks, new business policies causing significant hardship etc.
Medium	Likely to occur in the mid-term (within 3 to 6 months) - Supply Wisdom recommends reviewing current mitigation steps and being ready to take proactive actions if and when situation deteriorates further. Examples of Medium level alert events may include unplanned C-level exits, suppliers caught in bribery cases, economy slipping into recession.
Low	Possible in the long-term (after 6 months) - Supply Wisdom recommends taking proactive action if situation does not resolve. Examples of Low level alert events may include lawsuits filed against suppliers, client losses, air pollution alerts issued by country's local authorities, unexpected holidays announced for the location etc.
Informational	The event is pertinent information but does not have a risk element associated with it. Examples of Info level alert events may include launch of new solutions, partnerships signed, industry outlook, positive changes in government policies, announcements regarding launch of software parks/ free trade zones/special economic zones etc.
