IMPACT LEVEL:

Update 24: United States of America - Imposes New Restrictions Amid Surge in COVID-19 Cases; COVID-19 Deaths Top 400,000

- On January 21, 2021, US President Joe Biden signed a series of executive orders to address COVID-19 challenges, including wearing masks and making COVID-19 tests followed by quarantine mandatory for all travellers coming from overseas
- The President said the death toll from COVID-19 would probably top 500,000 next month, painting a grim picture of what he said would be a difficult time for the country
- The President said the plan starts with mounting an aggressive, safe, and effective vaccination campaign to meet the goal of administering 100 million shots in the first 100 days in office
- The President has directed the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to start standing up the first federally supported community vaccination centres
- The goal is to stand up 100 centres within the next month, he said
- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) will launch the federal pharmacy programme to make vaccines available to communities beginning early February 2021
- The President also signed an executive action to use the Defense Production Act and all other available authorities to direct all federal agencies and private industry to accelerate the making of everything that's needed to protect, test, vaccinate, and take care of people
- On January 20, 2021, the US recorded 4,375 deaths, the second-highest daily toll after January 12, 2021, when COVID-19 fatalities hit a record
- Hospitalizations, however, have been declining every day since January 12, 2021, falling from 131,326 to 122,700 on January 20, 2021, according to the Covid Tracking Project
- Vaccinations in the US began December 14, 2020, with health-care workers, and so far 18.4 million shots have been given, according to Bloomberg and CDC
- At least 2.58 million people have completed the two-dose vaccination regimen
- As of now, the country has reported 25,196,086 confirmed COVID-19 cases with 420,285 deaths, 1.7% of the total reported cases and 15,100,991 recoveries, 59.9% of the total reported cases
- When compared to the overall population of the country, confirmed COVID-19 cases and fatality rate stands at 7.59% and 0.13%, respectively

Impact level Definitions

Impact Level	Definitions
Immediate	Certain - Supply Wisdom recommends considering prompt action. Examples of Immediate level alert events may include bankruptcy filings, data breaches, unexpected curfews, strikes, power black-outs, major geo-political events etc.
High	Highly likely to occur in the near term (within 3 months) - Supply Wisdom recommends being in a state of readiness to take quick action. Examples of High level alert events may include withdrawal of rating by ratings agencies, hostile takeover, multiple cyber-attacks, new business policies causing significant hardship etc.
Medium	Likely to occur in the mid-term (within 3 to 6 months) - Supply Wisdom recommends reviewing current mitigation steps and being ready to take proactive actions if and when situation deteriorates further. Examples of Medium level alert events may include unplanned C-level exits, suppliers caught in bribery cases, economy slipping into recession.
Low	Possible in the long-term (after 6 months) - Supply Wisdom recommends taking proactive action if situation does not resolve. Examples of Low level alert events may include lawsuits filed against suppliers, client losses, air pollution alerts issued by country's local authorities, unexpected holidays announced for the location etc.
Informational	The event is pertinent information but does not have a risk element associated with it. Examples of Info level alert events may include launch of new solutions, partnerships signed, industry outlook, positive changes in government policies, announcements regarding launch of software parks/ free trade zones/special economic zones etc.

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
