

# Update 34: Colombia - Imposes New Restrictions for Travelers Starting from April 7, 2021 to Curb the Spread of COVID-19 Infections

- The Ministry of Health and Social Protection of Colombia announced through Resolution 411/2021 that as of April 7, 2021, all non-resident foreigners who enter the country by air, regardless of origin, must present proof Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) negative for COVID-19 performed within 96 hours of arrival
- Colombian citizens or resident foreigners who do not take the test at the origin may take it upon arrival in Colombia and keep an initial quarantine until they have the relevant results
- If the test is not performed, passengers must be isolated for 14 days at home
- The resolution also updated the biosecurity measures unifying the scopes both in national and international flights
- The continuity in the use of the CoronApp application on domestic flights and the Check-Mig on international flights is required
- Other measures announced are the safe opening of VIP lounges at airports and the temperature measurement at the entrance of the air terminals is withdrawn
- In addition, on flights of more than two hours, passengers will only be able to eat at intervals assigned by rows and everyone should wear a face mask
- As of now, the country has reported 2,417,826 confirmed COVID-19 cases with 63,614 deaths, 2.63% of total reported cases, and 2,292,803 recoveries, 94.82% of the total reported cases
- When compared to the overall population of the country, confirmed COVID-19 cases and fatality rate stands at 4.71% and 0.12%, respectively
- In total, 21,21,530 people have received vaccine doses and 2,62,707 people, 0.53% of total population have been fully vaccinated against COVID-19

# Impact level Definitions

Impact Level	Definitions
Immediate	<b>Certain</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends considering prompt action. Examples of Immediate level alert events may include bankruptcy filings, data breaches, unexpected curfews, strikes, power black-outs, major geo-political events etc.
High	<b>Highly likely to occur in the near term (within 3 months)</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends being in a state of readiness to take quick action. Examples of High level alert events may include withdrawal of rating by ratings agencies, hostile takeover, multiple cyber-attacks, new business policies causing significant hardship etc.
Medium	<b>Likely to occur in the mid-term (within 3 to 6 months)</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends reviewing current mitigation steps and being ready to take proactive actions if and when situation deteriorates further. Examples of Medium level alert events may include unplanned C-level exits, suppliers caught in bribery cases, economy slipping into recession.
Low	<b>Possible in the long-term (after 6 months)</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends taking proactive action if situation does not resolve. Examples of Low level alert events may include lawsuits filed against suppliers, client losses, air pollution alerts issued by country's local authorities, unexpected holidays announced for the location etc.
Informational	The event is pertinent information but does not have a risk element associated with it. Examples of Info level alert events may include launch of new solutions, partnerships signed, industry outlook, positive changes in government policies, announcements regarding launch of software parks/ free trade zones/special economic zones etc.
