Update 49: Brazil - Reports First Case of South African COVID-19 Variant

- Brazil has recorded its first confirmed case of the highly contagious COVID-19 variant discovered in South Africa
- The Federal University of Minas Gerais stated in a statement that two samples taken in the city included a previously unseen set of 18 mutations, including some in the same genes modified by the South African variant and Brazil's already prevalent variant, known as P.1.
- The detection of additional variants adds to concerns that a COVID-19 wave battering Brazil may keep breaking grim records for weeks to come
- Sao Paulo, the country's biggest city, on April 07, 2021, stated that it would begin opening some 600 new graves per day, well beyond the record of 426 burials in a day on March 30, 2021
- According to researchers, the first local diagnosis, a woman in the city of Sorocaba, had not traveled abroad or come into contact with someone who did, indicating local community transmission
- Further analysis confirmed it as the first known local case of the variant widely circulating in South Africa and elsewhere
- Brazil's daily death toll from COVID-19 broke the 4,000-person mark on April 07, 2021
- Occupancy levels at Brazil's Intensive Care Units (ICU) have surpassed 90% in 21 of the country's 26 regional capitals, marking the highest rate since the pandemic was announced
- As of now, the country has reported 13,197,031 confirmed COVID-19 cases with 341,097 deaths, 2.6% of total reported cases, and 11,664,158 recoveries, 88.4% of total reported cases
- When compared to the overall population of the country, confirmed COVID-19 cases and fatality rate stands at 6.2% and 0.2% respectively
- In total, 22,850,791 people have received vaccine doses and 50,59,453 people, 2.4% of total population have been fully vaccinated against COVID-19

Impact level Definitions

Impact Level	Definitions
Immediate	Certain - Supply Wisdom recommends considering prompt action. Examples of Immediate level alert events may include bankruptcy filings, data breaches, unexpected curfews, strikes, power black-outs, major geo-political events etc.
High	Highly likely to occur in the near term (within 3 months) - Supply Wisdom recommends being in a state of readiness to take quick action. Examples of High level alert events may include withdrawal of rating by ratings agencies, hostile takeover, multiple cyber-attacks, new business policies causing significant hardship etc.
Medium	Likely to occur in the mid-term (within 3 to 6 months) - Supply Wisdom recommends reviewing current mitigation steps and being ready to take proactive actions if and when situation deteriorates further. Examples of Medium level alert events may include unplanned C-level exits, suppliers caught in bribery cases, economy slipping into recession.
Low	Possible in the long-term (after 6 months) - Supply Wisdom recommends taking proactive action if situation does not resolve. Examples of Low level alert events may include lawsuits filed against suppliers, client losses, air pollution alerts issued by country's local authorities, unexpected holidays announced for the location etc.
Informational	The event is pertinent information but does not have a risk element associated with it. Examples of Info level alert events may include launch of new solutions, partnerships signed, industry outlook, positive changes in government policies, announcements regarding launch of software parks/ free trade zones/special economic zones etc.
