

# Update 54: Pakistan - Imposes Complete Lockdown in Several Provinces Amid Surge in COVID-19 Cases

- The Sindh government has imposed a ban on public transport while markets, shopping malls picnic spots will remain closed from May 9, 2021 to May 16, 2021 to curb the spread of COVID-19
- Under the directives, unnecessary movement of people and gathering of any kind at any place has been banned
- All tourist spots, picnic places, including beaches and recreational parks shall remain closed
- The ban has also been imposed on all kinds of public transport within the city, inter-city and inter-provincial, except for private vehicles with half seating capacity
- Taxis, cabs, rickshaws are allowed for essential short distance travels meant for medical care and purchasing of essential items and with 50% occupancy of seats and standard operating procedures (SOPs)
- Transportation of goods is exempted from the ban
- All markets, businesses and shops will remain closed during the period except essential services
- Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa and Pakistan-administered Kashmir announced complete lockdowns over the Eid break from May 8, 2021 to May 16, 2021
- The public transport, tourist destinations, parks, business and shopping malls and markets will remain closed during the eight-day lockdown
- Islamabad authorities have announced full lockdown on May 7, 2021 from 6 pm (GMT+5) onwards
- Public transport will be suspended after 6 pm (GMT+5) on May 7, 2021 and all parks, recreational places, and commercial areas will also be closed
- Reported COVID-19 stats for Pakistan:
  1. Confirmed Cases: 854,240
  2. Deaths: 18,797 (2.2%)
  3. Recoveries: 752,712 (88.11%)
  4. Vaccine Doses Administered: 3,150,122

# Impact level Definitions

Impact Level	Definitions
Immediate	<b>Certain</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends considering prompt action. Examples of Immediate level alert events may include bankruptcy filings, data breaches, unexpected curfews, strikes, power black-outs, major geo-political events etc.
High	<b>Highly likely to occur in the near term (within 3 months)</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends being in a state of readiness to take quick action. Examples of High level alert events may include withdrawal of rating by ratings agencies, hostile takeover, multiple cyber-attacks, new business policies causing significant hardship etc.
Medium	<b>Likely to occur in the mid-term (within 3 to 6 months)</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends reviewing current mitigation steps and being ready to take proactive actions if and when situation deteriorates further. Examples of Medium level alert events may include unplanned C-level exits, suppliers caught in bribery cases, economy slipping into recession.
Low	<b>Possible in the long-term (after 6 months)</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends taking proactive action if situation does not resolve. Examples of Low level alert events may include lawsuits filed against suppliers, client losses, air pollution alerts issued by country's local authorities, unexpected holidays announced for the location etc.
Informational	The event is pertinent information but does not have a risk element associated with it. Examples of Info level alert events may include launch of new solutions, partnerships signed, industry outlook, positive changes in government policies, announcements regarding launch of software parks/ free trade zones/special economic zones etc.
